*...and stubbornness as bad as worshipping  
idols...*

1 Samuel 15:23 NLT

As our heavenly Father prepares us for the transition into the “new season”, there will be some who resist the transition with everything they can. When we stubbornly push against God’s ordained move, it isn’t a sign of an eccentric character – rather it is a sign that idolatry resides in the heart. Why? **Idolatry is shifting our love for the Lord onto other people or objects** (Revelation 2:1-7). A divided heart will produce divided loyalties. God makes it clear, that we haven’t the talent for serving two masters (Matthew 6:24). Stubbornness against change means we are not willing to flow with God’s move. If our hearts are obsessed about something/someone in the “old season” than we will struggle to step into the “new season”. As the two masters begin to exercise their rule, they will tug at our hearts causing insecurity. At some point, we will have to choose a side. Idolatry is harmful because it affects our choices, which are biased towards that which steals our affection from God. He is a jealous God and will not tolerate unlawful tenants in our hearts that would keep us trapped in the “old season”. Repentance from Idolatry is an important key for us in moving forward.
